## Sports Premium 2017-18

### The Sports Premium Grant

The Government is spending over £450 million on this funding to provide new, sustainable and substantial primary school sport funding. This funding is being jointly met and provided by the Departments for Education, Health & Culture and Media and Sport - and shall see money going directly to primary school Headteachers and Principals to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The sport funding can only be spent on Sport and PE provision at Newark Hill Academy. We have joint priorities with the Greenwood Dale Foundation Trust.

Funding for schools is calculated by the number of primary aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11). All schools with 17 or more primary aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £16,000 plus a premium of £10 per pupil. For Newark Hill Academy this calculates as follows:

- Total number of primary aged pupils between the ages of 5-11 = 425
- Total amount of Sport Premium Grant received £20250 ( $£16000 + (425 \times £10)$ )
